

Writing Assignments in the Age of AI



Instructional techniques, activities to consider:

Use some or all of these ideas to help ensure students are appropriately doing the work required.

Allowable AI Usage

- Clearly stated on Syllabus
- Clearly defined in Rubrics
 - Reiterated in Assignment Instructions
- Remind students about Academic Integrity
 - AI Literacy incorporated into courses
 - Explicit clear relevancy given to students as to why or why not regarding use of AI for an assignment/eval

- ★ Break up the writing assignments into different parts (such as the 7-step writing process: topic, brainstorming, outline, rough draft, etc.)
 - some parts could be done in class
 - some parts could use AI, *if allowed*
- ★ Require an annotated bibliography (make students explain why they specifically chose their references)
- ★ Require a rough draft done with "track changes" on to see their work/development
- ★ Class discussion about topics chosen: the student should be fully involved in the process and able to explain why they are writing about different topic aspects
- ★ Incorporate a graded oral presentation: this would help ensure that the student learned about the topic and can answer on the spot questions about it *
- ★ Increase penalties for false or made-up "hallucinated" in-text citations, references, and quotes - helps ensure more time spent proofreading, knowing text
- ★ Clearly explain the skills being developed by going through the writing process, not using AI at this time on this assignment
